Delta Community Sponsors Scholarship Fair

Helping High School Students Navigate College Financing Options



Delta Community helped more than 500 high school students and their families navigate the complicated process of financial aid by supporting the 10th annual “I AM College Bound” Fair. Our Community Development team conducted sessions on Budgeting and Money Management. The event, which is part of both the College Bound Initiative from the United Way® and The Scholarship Academy, was free and open to Georgia high school juniors and seniors.

As part of its services, this event provided one-on-one Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) submission help. It also provided the opportunity for students to apply for scholarships and learn about other local, state and federal-based financial aid and scholarship opportunities. The Scholarship Academy received a grant from Delta Community to fund its Financial Aid Quiz Bowl game series.

Scholarship Program

For the 15th year, the Delta Community Scholarship Program supported exceptional students seeking college degrees. The Scholarship Program awarded \$25,000 to five students, all of whom attended high schools in metro Atlanta.

Winners were chosen based on academic achievement and submission of an essay based on the following topic:

Financial Education Center

Offering Financial Knowledge During Uncertain Times

The Financial Education Center (FEC) is an integral part of Delta Community's effort to deliver on its mission to improve the financial well-being of our members and the communities we're privileged to serve.

In 2020, the FEC delivered 183 workshops and webinars to adults and youth covering 36 different topics. More than 7,100 current and prospective members participated in 2,100 individual coaching and counseling sessions.



In an effort to provide education and financial guidance to our members and communities during the rise of COVID-19, our Financial Education Center released the Financial :15 Webinar Series, a three-part series of 15-minute on-demand webinars.

Horizon's Atlanta: College financing presentation reached 200 high school students from underserved communities as part of their six-week summer learning experience.

Cool Cash Money Camps

Conducted Virtually for First Time Due to COVID-19



The 2020 Cool Cash Money Camps were held in July, with more than 230 children participating in morning and afternoon sessions facilitated by Financial Education Center Manager Ryan Behrens, and Community Development Representatives Taylor Harding and William Wesley.

The camps, which are part of Delta Community's Financial Education Center, are designed to promote financial literacy among children ages 7 to 14 through fun, interactive money basics discussions and games. In 2020, the camps were offered virtually rather than in person, due to the ongoing COVID-19 health crisis.

Children's Miracle Network

Delta Community Donation Helps Doctors & Nurses

As part of the Credit Union's ongoing investment in local communities, Delta Community donated 5,000 surgical masks to Children's Healthcare of Atlanta-Scottish Rite in April 2020. The government-rated N95 masks are used by medical professionals working on the frontlines during the COVID-19 health crisis in local Children's hospital locations.

"These masks will be used by our doctors and nurses who work closely with patients," explained pediatric registered nurse Jane Fredericks, who accepted a mask shipment at Children's. "N95 masks greatly reduce our risk of infection, and we are deeply grateful to Delta Community."

"Regular investment in Children's and Children's Miracle Network has long been a part of our corporate giving strategy," said Jai Rogers, Delta Community's Vice President of Business and Community Development.



Delta Community Schools Program Sponsors Virtual Field Trips

“Schoolhouse Rock Live!”



Delta Community is committed to supporting education in the counties that we serve. Through our Schools Program, we provide resources to help our local school districts thrive.

Delta Community partnered with City Springs Theatre Company (CSTC) to offer a unique virtual field trip for over 49,000 students and teachers. CSTC re-imagined its education program offerings to best serve its student population due to the COVID-19 pandemic. To effectively serve students virtually in the arts, CSTC filmed a production of “Schoolhouse Rock Live!”.

This event was distributed to schools in Georgia as a virtual student matinee during the 2020 school year. For more than forty years, Schoolhouse Rock! has helped students understand and expand on school curriculums through music and animation with a series that now includes over 60 songs. The production is also tied to Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) and targets students in grades K-6.

In response to the unexpected impact COVID-19 had on the metro Atlanta community, the Business and Community Development department immediately shifted its focus to provide financial assistance to small businesses and organizations. Sponsorship allocations were repurposed to create the COVID-19 Special Fund to support Emergency Relief Efforts, Small Business sustainability needs, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion programs and Financial Wellness workshops.
